

# CONQUEST



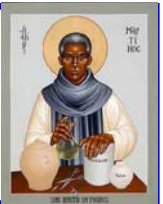
**FORGED IN VIRTUE. CALLED TO SERVE.**

The Father/Son boys learned the story of Noah from the Old Testament; how God told Noah to build an ark for his family and for the animals of the earth. Noah did what God wanted him to do even though it was not the popular thing to do. God kept Noah, his family and the animals safe from the flooding waters that covered the earth for many days.

The Junior Division boys are learning about St. Martin de Porres. St. Martin was an African man who learned to be a barber and man of medicine. He was known for his charity for the poor of his time even when he was criticized by the others around him. St. Martin was a very generous man who dedicated his life to God and to the many needy people of his day. He cared for them and invited others to care for the sick and the poor.



The ECYD-age boys started their own program across the hall with Mr. Sutkowski and Br. Juan. These 11-16 year old boys are learning about God and how they can best serve Him. They will learn about teamwork and being more effective working in a group to accomplish big things for God's Church and for the community.

During the evening the boys enjoyed a story by Fr. Branigan Sherman. Fr. Branigan told the boys how jumping into 6 feet of freshly fallen snow is like jumping into God's hands.
